

#### Empowering your students to lead the future

Winning battles for the future of our Nation requires a thinking force, and it is for this reason that the Marine Corps invests in continued education, giving your students every opportunity they need to sharpen their minds. First, students must qualify via the Armed Service Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). From there, they will push themselves to earn the title Marine by finding ways to prevail through the challenges of recruit training. Upon earning the title, Marines continue their education by mastering their Military Occupational Specialties (MOS), extending their classroom learning to a fulfilled calling.

#### **Recruit Training**

There are few reputations more storied and none more deserving than that of Marine Corps Recruit Training. The difficulties this process presents to every recruit are as deliberate as they are legendary–as physical, mental, and moral toughness are prerequisites to fight among our ranks. During these 13 weeks of intense training, it is not enough to simply endure, aspiring Marines must prevail. Tapping into the purpose that brought them there, to win for the Nation they fight for.

For certain students, the best path to recruit training may be through the Delayed Entry Program (DEP), where Recruiters help students train academically and physically to meet fitness and knowledge goals before taking on the real test.


